Equity and the reduction of barriers to service are front-of-mind for Library Board and staff, which is reflected in the goals laid out in the 2025-2029 Strategic Plan.



Strategic Goals 2025-2029



Accessibility and Inclusivity

Accessibility and inclusivity go together. We will investigate avenues and pursue grants to improve accessibility within the building. This goal would have PSPL work toward the removal of barriers, with the objective of making library services more widely available to everyone in our communities.



Improvements are constantly underway, such as the addition of the mute boxes in 2022 and the replacement of the three rooftop HVAC units in 2023. This goal would emphasize continuing to improve the library space. An asset management report will be obtained.



Increase Recreational Activities

In alignment with the Town of Parry Sound's 2023 – 2026
Strategic Action Plan, the Library will continue to offer a diverse selection of social programs for all ages and abilities. This goal would speak to expanding both regular programs and special events, especially in collaboration with the Town of Parry Sound and our contracting municipalities. Outreach to summer residents will be improved, with advertising at campgrounds and around the downtown (e.g. Mary Street Centre.)





Build Community Pride

Mirroring the Town of Parry Sound's 2023 – 2026 Strategic Action Plan, the Library will continue to facilitate events and work with organizations and community partners, including our contracting municipalities, to promote activities, increase attendance, express culture and support quality of life in our communities.

Continue to Apply for Grants, Fundraise, and Pursue Donations

PSPL will continue to pursue grants, through both government and other sources of funding, such as local service clubs and organizations. This would include a more dedicated eye toward generating revenue via fundraising and promotion of library services such as facility rentals.
